From Our Rabbi

Happiness can be found, even in the darkest of times, if one only remembers to turn on the light."- J.K. Rowling

In her book, Men in Dark Times, Hannah Arendt wrote: "That even in the darkest of times we have the right to expect some illumination, and that such illumination may well come...from the uncertain, flickering, and often weak light that some men and women, in their lives and their works...eyes so used to darkness as ours will hardly be able to tell whether their light was the light of a candle or that of a blazing sun." As I'm writing, it's been just over a week since Israel, our People, were brutally attacked by Hamas terrorists on Semini Atzeret/Simchat Torah 2023/5784. The hostages are still being held captive, rockets are still being launched, and the world seems to be in "Dark Times."

We might find a glimmer of hope as we anticipate the next Jewish Holiday, Chanukah - The Festival of Lights. The 19th century, Sfat Emet commented: "Especially at this season, when lights were miraculously lit for Israel even though they did not have enough oil, there remains **light even now to help us**, with the aid of these Hanukkah candles, to **find that hidden light within**. "The Chanukah Menorah's light increases with each passing day, growing brighter until the entire vessel is fully eliminated. All it takes is to begin with one small flame. Proverbs says, "Ner Hashem Nishmat Adam, the Spirit of Mankind is the Light of Hashem." Little by little, one by one, we can bring more light into these Dark Times.

The words of our ancient prophet, Isaiah (42:6-8), tells us everything: "I G-d, in My grace, have summoned you, and I have grasped you by the hand. I created you, and appointed you a covenant people, **a Light onto nations**— opening eyes deprived of light, rescuing prisonniers from confinement, from the dungeon those who sit in darkness. I am the L-rd, that is My name; I will not yield My glory to another, nor my praise to idols." To help us find our "hidden light within," perhaps, the following nightly meditations could serve to be beneficial as we kindle the Chanukah Lights each night this year:

Night 1:

Meditation: As we kindle this first candle, let it remind us of the power of beginnings. Just as the Maccabees embarked on their courageous journey to reclaim the Temple, may this Chanukah mark the start of our own meaningful paths to positive change.

"In the beginning, G-d created the heavens and the earth." - Genesis 1:1

Night 2:

Meditation: As the second candle joins the first, let it illuminate the idea of partnership and unity. Just as the two candles together shine brighter, may we remember that our collective strength and collaboration can overcome any darkness.

"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much." - Helen Keller

"Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!" - Psalm 133:1

Night 3:

Meditation: On this third night, let the flame symbolize the lessons of resilience. The menorah shines brightly even in the face of adversity, teaching us that our inner strength can help us endure and emerge stronger.

"The greatest glory in living lies not in never falling, but in rising every time we fall." - Nelson Mandela "For a righteous man may fall seven times and rise again." - Proverbs 24:16

Night 4:

Meditation: As we kindle the fourth candle, contemplate the concept of spreading light. Just as one candle can light another without diminishing its own flame, may our acts of kindness and generosity inspire others to do the same.

"Thousands of candles can be lit from a single candle, and the life of the candle will not be shortened." - Buddha "The candle of G-d is the soul of a person." - Proverbs 20:27

Night 5:

Meditation: As the fifth candle shines, let it remind us of the importance of faith. Just as the Maccabees had faith in their cause, may we hold onto our beliefs and values with unwavering trust, even in challenging times.

"Faith is taking the first step even when you don't see the whole staircase." - Martin Luther King Jr.

"Trust in the L-rd with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding." - Proverbs 3:5

Night 6:

Meditation: On this sixth night, let us think about the idea of family and community. Just as our gatherings around the menorah strengthen our bonds, may our connections with loved ones and our community bring warmth and support.

"All of Israel is responsible for one another." -Talmud Shevuot 39a

Night 7:

Meditation: As we kindle the seventh candle, ponder the concept of gratitude. Let us reflect on the blessings in our lives, acknowledging the abundance that surrounds us, and express thanks for the light that guides us.

"Gratitude makes sense of our past, brings peace for today, and creates a vision for tomorrow." - Melody Beattie "Give thanks to the L-rd, for He is good; His steadfast love endures forever!" - Psalm 107:1

Night 8:

Meditation: On this final night of Chanukah, let the eight candles represent the infinite potential for goodness in the world. As we conclude this holiday, may we carry the message of Chanukah's enduring light with us, spreading hope and love wherever we go.

This Chanukah, may we witness a level of Light and Love filling the entire World that permanently expels any and all remnants of darkness. *Amen*!

Message from our President



As I begin to write this month's article, I intended to speak about how wonderful the High Holiday services were this year. Covid had mostly disappeared. We visited with many members that had been previously on Zoom, but now in person. We introduced new members to our Temple family by having honors. Sallee and I were given the honor of Chattan Torah and Chattan Beresheit. On Simchat Torah it is customary to honor those who have dedicated themselves to the Temple.

But now with the events that have unfolded in Israel, I find myself having difficulties expressing my feelings. Like many of you, Sallee and I have immediate family and friends in Israel. We have spoken to them and will continue to communicate throughout this conflict. We are scheduled to go to Israel in December to celebrate my youngest nephew's wedding. His name is Aron. Unfortunately, he has been called up to serve like many hundreds of thousand soldiers. We're hoping that our plans don't change. (pic 1. Passover 2023, pic 2. Oct.11, 2023)

Fifty years ago, almost to the day in 1973. We saw many Egyptian and Syrian forces invade Israel in a surprise attack on the holiest day of the Jewish year, Yom Kippur. Not only were many Israelis unprepared because they were in synagogue or otherwise marking the solemn fast day, but Israeli intelligence agencies had failed to





take seriously the threat of an attack by Egypt, Israel's largest neighbor and foe. Now in 2023, almost 50 years to the day a major enemy of Israel, Hamas, launched an attack on a day marked by the convergence of the Jewish Sabbath and the holiday of Simchat Torah (one of the most celebratory days in the Jewish calendar).

Unlike in 1973, this attack was directed against civilians, as well as the military, and the results have been devastating. The death toll from the massacre is rising by the hour.

"Our political position now makes no difference. Left, right, center, pro-occupation or anti-occupation, or don't know about it----we're hurting and we're shocked and we're horrified and we want Israel to get through this."



First, you'll meet Ilana Shemesh, the founder of the Center. Next, you'll be introduced to Dafnah Sizomu who, in turn, will introduce us to the Abayudaya Jewish community of Uganda.



The Shifrah and Puah Maternity Center in Uganda was "built" in July 2018, due to the efforts of an Israeli nurse and midwife, Ilana Shemesh, who wanted to improve the maternal and infant mortality rates in Uganda.

All services provided by the center are completely free of charge to encourage women to come in for prenatal, birth and post-partum services rather than going through their pregnancies unassisted. The center is dependent on donations. That's where we come in.

Help us support the women of Uganda and the work that was started in 2018. With your donation we can help maintain and improve the degree of health and wellbeing of the women and their babies of Abayudaya, Uganda.

Here are just a few examples of what we can help cover with your donations:




